

Matthew 27:45-49 (NLT)

At noon, darkness fell across the whole land until three o'clock. At about three o'clock, Jesus called out with a loud voice, "Eli, Eli lema sabachthani?" which means "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

Some of the bystanders misunderstood and thought he was calling for the prophet Elijah. One of them ran and filled a sponge with sour wine, holding it up to him on a reed stick so he could drink. But the rest said, "Wait! Let's see whether Elijah comes to save him."

Forsaken:

To quit or leave entirely; to desert; to abandon; to depart or withdraw from; to leave; to renounce; to reject; to refuse.

Have you ever felt abandoned, deserted, or rejected?

What causes you to feel forsaken by God?

Most of what causes you to feel abandoned or rejected by God is a result of your own sinful behavior. That which isn't of your own making is usually a result of someone else's sin that directly affects you.

Was Jesus really abandoned by God?

Yes—for the first and only time in His life.

Jesus knew the hurt and pain of being abandoned by others.

Israel abandoned Him.

He came to his own people, and even they rejected him.

John 1:11 (NLT)

• His family abandoned Him.

For even His brothers did not believe in him.

John 7:5 (NIV)

His friends abandoned Him.

Then all the disciples deserted him and fled.

Matthew 26:56 (NIV)

Why did God abandon Him?

He died for our sin—in our place—as our substitute.

All of us like sheep have strayed away. We have left God's paths to follow our own. Yet the Lord laid on him the sins of us all.

Isaiah 53:6 (NLT)

What does sin do?

•	Sin	
	He humbled himself in obedience to God and died a criminal's death on a cross.	Philippians 2:8 (NLT)
	Sin	
	But your iniquities have made a separation between you and your God.	Isaiah 59:2 (ESV)
•	Sin	
	It's your sins that have cut you off from God.	Isaiah 59:2 (NLT)

The Bottom Line

- Jesus was forsaken that we may never be forsaken.
- He was forsaken for <u>one</u> moment that we may never be forsaken for <u>any</u> moment.

Christ had no sin, but God made him become sin so that in Christ we could become right with God.
