ı.	The wrong kind of
	Acts 10:1–2 (NASB): Now there was a man at Caesarea named Cornelius, a centurion of what was called the Italian cohort, <sup>2</sup> a devout man and one who feared God with all his household, and gave many alms to the Jewish people and prayed to God continually.
II.	The wrong kind of
	Acts 10:14–16 (NASB): But Peter said, "By no means, Lord, for I have never eaten anything unholy and unclean." Again a voice came to him a second time, "What God has cleansed, no longer consider unholy." <sup>16</sup> This happened three times, and immediately the object was taken up into the sky.
	Acts 10:24–29 (NASB): On the following day he entered Caesarea. Now Cornelius was waiting for them and had called together his relatives and close friends. <sup>25</sup> When Peter entered, Cornelius met him, and fell at his feet and worshiped him. <sup>26</sup> But Peter raised him up, saying, "Stand up; I too am just a man." <sup>27</sup> As he talked with him, he entered and found many people assembled. <sup>28</sup> And he said to them, "You yourselves know how unlawful it is for a man who is a Jew to associate with a foreigner or to visit him; and yet God has shown me that I should not call any man unholy of unclean. <sup>29</sup> That is why I came without even raising any objection when I was sent for. So I ask for what reason you have sent for me."
III.	The right kind of
	Acts 10:34–35 (NASB): Opening his mouth, Peter said: "I most certainly understand now that <u>God is not one to show partiality</u> , <sup>35</sup> <u>but in every nation the man who fears Him and does what is right is welcome to Him</u> .
	Acts 10:44–48 (NASB): While Peter was still speaking these words, the Holy Spirit fell upon all those who were listening to the message. <sup>45</sup> All the circumcised believers who came with Peter were amazed, because the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out on the Gentiles also. <sup>46</sup> For they were hearing them speaking with tongues and exalting God. Then Peter answered, <sup>47</sup> "Surely no one can refuse the water for these to be baptized who have received the Holy Spirit just as we did, can he?" <sup>48</sup> And he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they asked him to stay on for a few days.
