Someone dressed in soft robes? Look, those who wear soft robes are in royal palaces. ⁹ What, then, did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. ¹⁰ This is the one about whom it is written, 'See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way before you.'..." (NRSV)

2 Corinthians 1:20–22 For <u>no matter how many promises God has made, they are "Yes" **in Christ**</u>. And so through him the "Amen" is spoken by us to the glory of God. ²¹ Now <u>it is God who makes both us and you stand firm **in Christ**</u>. He anointed us, ²² set his seal of ownership on us, and put his Spirit in our hearts as a deposit, <u>guaranteeing what is</u> <u>to come</u>. (NIV)

2. By ______ with ______.

1 John 5:14–15 And <u>this is the confidence that we have</u> toward him, that <u>if we ask anything **according to his will**</u> <u>he hears us</u>. ¹⁵ And if we know that he hears us in whatever we ask, we know that <u>we have the requests that we have</u> <u>asked of him</u>. (ESV)

3. By embracing God's ______ and _____. Hebrews 10:24–25 And let us consider how to <u>stir up one another to love and good works</u>, ²⁵ not neglecting to <u>meet together</u>, as is the habit of some, but <u>encouraging one another</u>, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near. (ESV)
