#### **SAMUEL RESPONDS**

And the LORD told him: "Listen to all that the people are saying to you; it is not you they have rejected, but they have rejected me as their king...Now listen to them; but warn them solemnly and let them know what the king who will reign over them will claim as his rights."

 The result? Saul was chosen as king over Israel. But it didn't last, and God started searching for a replacement, a different king.

- Served King Saul as his personal musician and armor-bearer.
- Giant slayer.
- Strong in battle but weak, fallible and sinful in his relationships.
- The most famous ancestor of Jesus and greatest king of Israel.
- Listed among the great heroes of the faith in Hebrews 11.
- Called by God a MAN AFTER GOD'S OWN HEART.
