The End of David's Life – A Time to Take Stock

A. David's Achievements

- Restored Israel's confidence and hope fighting against Goliath.
- Served as an accomplished military officer under King Saul.
- Faithfully shepherded 600 men and women while on the run.
- Established a new capital city for the nation.
- Refused to deviate from God's plan for his life when he wanted to build a temple and God said no.
- Humbled himself before God and repented after his greatest sin.
- Established a kingdom secure from all surrounding enemies.
- Established a lasting dynasty that would go on to bring the promised Messiah into the world to save us from our sins.

B. David's Words of Wisdom for Solomon

When David's time to die was near, he told his son Solomon, "I am going the way of all the earth. So be strong. Show yourself to be a man. Do what the Lord your God tells you. Walk in His ways. Keep all His Laws and His Word, by what is written in the Law of Moses. Then you will do well in all that you do and in every place you go. Then the Lord will keep His promise to me. He has said to me, 'Your sons must be careful of their way, to walk before Me in truth with all their heart and soul. If they do, you will never be without a man on the throne of Israel.'
