Jesus, the Navigator of our hearts

He called out to them, "Friends, haven't you any fish?" "No," they answered. He said, "Throw your net on the right side of the boat and you will find some." When they did, they were unable to haul the net in because of the large number of fish."

John 21:5-6 (NIV)

"It happens very often that the man with the hand-net must rely on the advice of someone on shore... because in the clear water he can often see a school of fish invisible to the man in the water...Jesus was acting as a guide to his disciples."

Peter ran to Jesus with ...

- John 21:7 (NIV)
- By eagerly jumping into the water and putting on his outer garment to show proper respect.

The unforgettable breakfast

- John 21:9-12 (NIV)
- Jesus invited His disciples to have a holy supper.
- The Holy Communion captures this holy breakfast scene.

Major shift in the Story

- John 21:15-17 (NIV)
- Jesus called Peter by his full name.
- Agape (Greek): The sacrificial or unconditional love of God.
- Phileo (Greek): "Friendship love" ... "Brotherly or sisterly love."

Peter's reinstatement

• "Jesus, in His gracious forgiveness, gave Peter the chance to wipe out the memory of the threefold denial by a threefold declaration of love."

• Peter's call to shepherd God's church was reinstated in this chapter.
