BEARING FALSE WITNESS - WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- 1. It led to the **FALL** of **HUMANITY**.
- 2. It distorts and impairs our sense of **REALITY**.
- 3. It attacks the credibility of **OBJECTIVE TRUTH**.

WHAT THE STORY OF NABOTH'S VINEYARD CAN TEACH US

- 1. TRUTH must not be rejected for CONVENIENCE.
- 2. Truth is compromised when we **ENABLE FALSEHOOD**.
- 3. Bearing false witness always claims its **VICTIMS**.

The story of Naboth's vineyard teaches us **TO NOT HANDLE THE TRUTH LIGHTLY**.

WHAT DOES IT LOOK LIKE TO EMBRACE THE TRUTH?

- 1. Learn to **DISCERN** truth from falsehood.
- 2. In a world of confusion, ask for the **SPIRIT** of **TRUTH** to reveal it to you.
- 3. Live like you are **INTERDEPENDENT** with your neighbor.
- 4. Put Jesus' way of **LIFE** into **PRACTICE**.
