THE TRUTH ABOUT CHANGE

- Change is inevitable.
- Not all change is good, but God can use it for good.
- God can use my sin and mistakes to accomplish His purpose.
- Change is always a test of faith.

What does this mean?

1. That God is ______ over change.

For <u>in him all things were created</u>: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through him and for him. He is before all things, and <u>in him all things hold together</u>.

Colossians 1:16-17 (NIV)

2. That change is part of God's ______ for us.

Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, <u>I am doing a new thina</u>! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland.

Isaiah 43:18-19 (NIV)

WHY DO WE RESIST CHANGE?

1. We haven't prioritized ______.

<u>All Scripture is inspired by God</u> and is <u>useful to teach us</u> what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It <u>corrects us when we are wrong</u> and teaches us to do what is right.

2 Timothy 3:16-17 (NLT)

2. We fear we have something to ______.

Yes, everything else is worthless when compared with the infinite value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake <u>I have discarded everything else</u>, counting it all as garbage, so that I could gain Christ and become one with him.

3. We want to maintain the illusion of _____

Many are the plans in a person's heart, but it is the LORD's purpose that prevails.

Proverbs 19:21 (NIV)

4. We work to avoid any kind of ______.

I am not sorry that I sent that severe letter to you, though I was sorry at first, for I know it was painful to you for a little while. Now I am glad I sent it, not because it hurt you, but because <u>the pain caused you to repent and change your ways</u>.

2 Corinthians 7:8-9 (NLT)

WHY SHOULD WE EMBRACE CHANGE?

<u>God saved you by his grace</u> when you believed. And you can't take credit for this; it is a gift from God. Salvation is not a reward for the good things we have done, so none of us can boast about it. For we are God's masterpiece. He has <u>created us anew in Christ Jesus</u>, so we <u>can do the good things he planned for us</u> long ago.

Ephesians 2:8-10 (NLT)

HOW DO WE EMBRACE CHANGE?

1. _____ the need to change.

Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already arrived at my goal, but <u>I press on to</u> <u>take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me. Brothers and sisters, I do not</u> <u>consider myself yet to have taken hold of it</u>. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus.

Philippians 3:12-14 (NIV)

2. Seek ______ and _____ on what you can change.

<u>If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God</u>, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you. James 1:5 (NIV)

- God's will is our roadmap for life. Wisdom is our GPS.
- You can't change others.
- Small changes often lead to bigger changes.

3. Adopt a posture of ______.

God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble...<u>Humble yourselves before the Lord</u>, and he will lift you up in honor.

James 4:6, 10 (NLT)

<u>Jesus Christ is the same</u> yesterday and today and forever. Hebrews 13:8 (ESV)

Trust in the Lord with all your heart; <u>do not depend on your own understanding. Seek his will</u> <u>in all you do</u>, and he will show you which path to take.

Proverbs 3:5-6 (NLT)
