- Had been 30 years since Jesus was crucified and resurrected.
- Had expected Jesus to return, but now wondered if he ever would.
- It was getting more and more difficult to hold on to their faith.
- Jews considered followers of Christ as heretics. Romans considered followers of Christ as a nuisance and a threat.
