MYTH: "I DON'T NEED CHURCH"

There is a significant tension present in Christian culture between the

We, in turn, can limit our experience of God to what we are searching for rather than allowing God to search us through the Church.

WHAT IS THE CHURCH?

Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and strangers, but **fellow citizens** with God's people and also **members of his household**, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone. HOW DO WE RECLAIM CHURCH AS COMMUNITY?

Awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were being done by the apostles. Now during those days, when the disciples were increasing in number, the Hellenists complained against the Hebrews because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution of food. And the twelve called together the whole community of the disciples and said, "It is not right that we should neglect the word of God in order to wait on tables. Therefore, friends, select from among yourselves seven men of good standing, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may appoint to this task, while we, for our part, will devote ourselves to prayer and to serving the word." What they said pleased the whole community, and they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and the Holy Spirit, together with Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolaus, a proselyte of Antioch. They had these men stand before the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them.

HOW DO WE RECLAIM CHURCH AS A MEANS OF GRACE?

Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful. WHAT IS THE CHURCH?

• The Church is intended to be **GOD'S DWELLING PLACE**, not ours.

HOW DO WE RECLAIM CHURCH AS A MEANS OF GRACE?

- The Church is the site of **ASSURANCE** for those who may not experience it anywhere else.
- Jesus' Church exists at the site of **HUMAN BROKENNESS**, not spiritual betterment.

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HOW DO WE RECLAIM CHURCH AS COMMUNITY?

- We need the Church because it ensures **MUTUAL EDIFICATION**.
- We need the Church because it is INCARNATIONAL.

HOW DO WE RECLAIM CHURCH AS MISSION?

- We need the Church because **OUR MISSION** counts on its place in the world.
- Without the Church, we would not have an expanded definition of "NEIGHBOR."

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
