On the Road to Damascus

(The voice to Saul) "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" (Saul to the voice) "Who are you?" (The voice to Saul) "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting."

### Across Town, Jesus Calls Ananias

"Go to the house of Judas on Straight Street and ask for a man from Tarsus named Saul, for he is praying. In a vision he has seen a man named Ananias come place his hands on him to restore his sight."

*"Go! This man is my chosen instrument to proclaim my name to the Gentiles..."* 

All these stories have a common theme. Jesus came to them. They did not go to Jesus and "sign-up." If you are a follower of Jesus, it's because Jesus came to you. He called you and you followed.

If someone asks you, "Why are you a Christian? Why are you a follower of Jesus?" what would you say?

Because

<u>You did not choose me; I chose you</u>. And I gave you this work: to go and produce fruit...

John 15:16 (NCV)

But <u>you are the ones chosen by God</u>, chosen for the high calling of priestly work, chosen to be a holy people, God's instruments to do his work and speak out for him, to tell others of the night-and-day difference he made for you from nothing to something, from rejected to accepted.

1 Peter 2:9-10 (MSG)

## Jesus Calls His First Disciples

As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. "<u>Come, follow me</u>," Jesus said, "and I will send you out to fish for people." At once they left their nets and followed him. Going on from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John. They were in a boat with their father Zebedee, preparing their nets. Jesus called them, and immediately they left the boat and their father and followed him.

### Matthew 4:18-22 (NIV)

As Jesus went on from there, he saw a man named Matthew sitting at the tax collector's booth. "<u>Follow me</u>," he told him, and Matthew got up and followed him.

### Matthew 9:9 (NIV)

At that point the disciples didn't even have a job description! When he finally revealed what their job was, he said:

"...proclaim this message: 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those who have leprosy, drive out demons. Freely you have received; freely give."

Matthew 10:7-8 (NIV)
